Ground Pangolin is an animal. Very few people have seen it or known it. It is rarely seen. It's eyes are red. It is witch because it can cause somebody's death.

People who have seen ground pangolin say that you do not approach it from the back and if you do so you have slim chances of survival. If you want to kill it just come from the front side.

A person who has killed a ground pangolin should pass through the ritual known as "amook" which drives away all evil because he has killed a bad and dreaded animal. Failure to do that leads to a person becoming weak and abnormal. 'Amook' is done by somebody who has gone through the same ritual, having encountered Amerek this way.

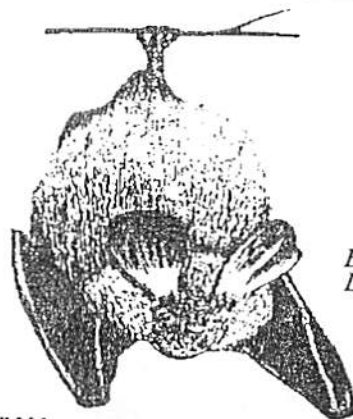

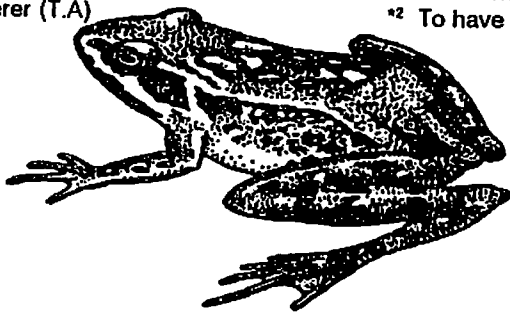

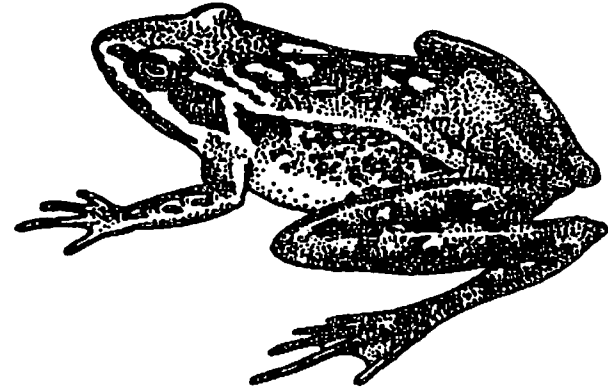

The frog is considered to be a prophet among the Turkana people. It is said to be a prophet because when a frog grows old it is believed to shed its skin and become a bat. One sometimes finds a grey bat that is believed to have been a long-nosed rat that has shed its skin and become a bat.

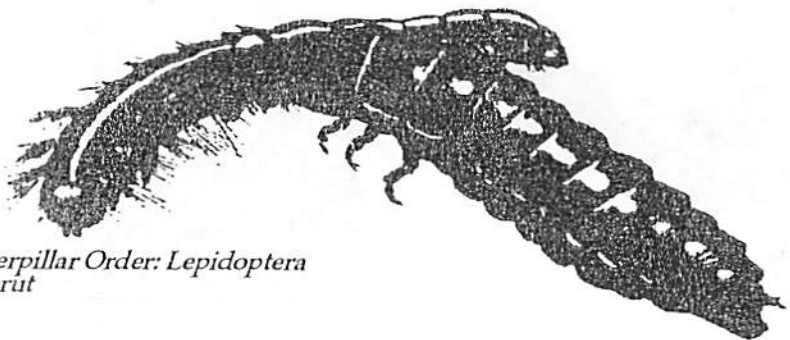
